1. About MAINS (The Master of Arts in Inter-Asia NGO Studies)

The program of Master of Arts in Inter-Asia NGO Studies started in 2007. Its multidisciplinary curriculum, together with practitioners' training, is unique in the field of studies on social change, non-governmental organizations and civil society in the Asian context. The curriculum covers a wide range of current issues from both regional and global perspectives, placing a special focus on the development of solidarity among civil society participants.

The MAINS is intended for those who have contributed, or have the potential to contribute, to the social change and development of civil society in Asia. With academic and practical resources in SungKongHoe University, MAINS offers intensive and flexible preparation for those who seek leadership and skills for more just and equitable social changes in Asia.

The MAINS program has evolved over the years to place more emphasis on the experience of democratization and development in Korea. More attention is also paid on the theory and practice of international development with special reference to the Asian context.





2. ADMISSION

1) Eligibility

We welcome applicants with an undergraduate degree, preferably in social science fields, and with experiences generally in the non-profit or non-governmental sectors in Asia and Korea.

Given the nature of the program, those applicants who are from the outside of Asian region will not be given a priority consideration in the admission. We are looking for individuals with sensitivity to, and involvement in, issues such as the promotion of social change, human rights, democratization, local community development, solidarity across borders, and humanitarian aid in Asia. We will particularly scrutinize these points through the process of admission decision.

Therefore an application with a sole purpose of career advancement in the NGO sector is not encouraged.

4) Admission Requirements

- Applicants who have a bachelor's or higher degree, or have university graduate equivalency approved by an authorized organization.
- Official English language ability test result within 2 years.

(The minimum requirement for any of the following: TOEFL 530, CBT 197, iBT 71, IELTS 5.5, CEFR B2, TEPS 600, New TEPS 326)

Under the Ministry of Education regulations, applicants with degrees above university degrees in countries where English is their native language or use it as a legal official language can be exempted from the official English test results. However, even if you are an applicant for the previous sentence, the admissions office recommends that you submit your official English test results in advance. This is because the admissions committee may require that the results of the official English test be submitted based on the results of the video interview.

If successful applicants who are required to submit their official English test results fail to submit them within the period, the admission committee will cancel their acceptance.

5) Evaluation

- Procedure: Documents Screening and Online Video Interview (Applicants who are deemed unsuitable for this program through document screening will not be interviewed)
- Method: The Admission committee will review and decide who will be offered admission and scholarship based on document and interview evaluation score.

3. CURRICULUM

1) Course Nature

The MAINS is an alternative social studies program taught in English with special reference to Asian civil society. The program particularly encourages applications from Asia and Korea having working experiences in non-governmental organizations in Asia. The MAINS offers an advanced and intensive program, with teaching methods based on individual self-research, mutual learning by students and thematic approaches. Reading and writing as well as debating and interacting with other students are strongly emphasized.

2) Course Structure

The MAINS is 18-month, 4-quarter (including 6 months for field work and thesis writing) program consisting of core courses, elective courses, and a thesis-writing, making up a total of 24 credits. There is a particular theme given to each quarter as a synthesizing structure. Class schedules run from one quarter to the next with a week's break in between. Quarters have a varied number of sessions. Some courses may be taught intensively by visiting lecturers. Courses combine lectures and student-led seminars.

4. THESIS

All students are required to write a thesis or an equivalent research report on topics related to social change and non-profit/governmental sectors with special reference to democracy, development or civil society in Asia. Emphasis on the applicant' own country context strongly recommended. A special attention will be given to this point when the application is evaluated. The choice of topic outlined above will be the priority point of consideration throughout the entire admission process. In the third quarter, students should be able to defend their thesis/report proposal in the form of the First Chapter of the thesis. The fourth—the final—quarter is devoted mostly to the completion of the thesis/report, including field work, data collecting, writing-up and the final submission of the thesis.

5. TUITION, SCHOLARSHIP & OTHER EXPENSES

Full or partial scholarship may be given to the qualified students. Those from developing countries in Asia will be given a priority.

The scholarship consists of the tuition fees and the living stipend. The level of scholarship for each student is decided upon on the individual basis of the student's academic aptitude, grade, needs, and the individual circumstances. The scholarship for tuition and living expense is only given to the students who reside in Korea throughout the entire period of the first THREE terms. Provision of scholarship may be made invalid when the student takes 'time-off' during the course or when the student's academic achievement for the previous term falls behind the school regulation.

The scholarship of the tuition fee (for the entire four quarters) may be the full scholarship or the partial scholarship depending on our criteria. Please note that the scholarship does not cover the expense for the field work and writing-up of thesis for the last (fourth) quarter. The recipient of the scholarship will be notified of the result at the time of the notification of the admission offer.
